Fellowship Available: Acute & Chronic / Transitional Pain, University Health Network and University of Toronto

The University of Toronto and The Toronto General Hospital invites applications for fellowship training in acute & chronic pain management beginning July 2014. Fellowships have a 70:30 clinical:research split. Previous research experience is desirable.

Key faculty include: Hance Clarke MD PhD FRCPC, Joel Katz PhD, Rita Katznelson MD FRCPC, Paul Tumber MD FRCPC, Raynauld Ko MD FRCPC

This fellowship is 12 months which will be open to Anesthesiologists who are interested in comprehensive pain management. The fellow will work at the Toronto General Hospital Chronic/Transitional Pain Clinic and the Wasser Pain Management Centre. Both clinics are multidisciplinary with particular focus areas. At the Wasser Pain Management Centre the working colleagues will be Anesthesiologists, Neurologists, Craniofacial physicians, Psychologists, Psychiatrists, specialists in Addiction Medicine and Chemical Dependency, Gynecologists, Physiotherapists and Nurses. The fellow will spend 4 days per week performing clinical duties, which will include working in the operating room one day a week. One academic day will be given every week. Other rotations will be offered that could include 1) oncology pain service; 2) neurology (headache, pelvic pain and EMG); 3) interventional program (various anesthetic blocks including fluoroscopy and ultrasound guided techniques); 4) psychologists-psychiatrists; and 5) palliative/cancer pain program.
