A Message from The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada: Royal College Examination – Application Deadlines for Assessment of Training

Royal College Certification

Royal College certification assures your patients that you have met Canada's national standards for medical expertise in your specialist discipline. Obtaining certification is a two-step process.

Step 1: Confirm Your Eligibility

Confirm your eligibility to write a Royal College certification exam by completing the online assessment of training application. <http://www.royalcollege.ca/portal/page/portal/rc/credentials/start>

Deadline: April 30, 2016

- An email acknowledging receipt of your application will be emailed within two business days.
- A ruling letter outlining your eligibility for the 2017 certification exams will be sent in **December 2016**. Once granted, eligibility is valid for three years.

Step 2: Register for the Exam

Information on the registration process is sent via email once the assessment of training is complete. Your registration form and examination fee must be submitted by:

Deadline: February 1, 2017

Late registrations will not be accepted.
