Title: Recovering from severe traumatic brain injury – a patient's perspective

Speaker: Ms. Jamie Crane Mauzy, University of British Columbia

Jamie's Bio: *Jamie holds some pretty esteemed titles, such as being the first girl in the world to double flip in a slopestyle run (multiple jumps and rails) at the winter X-Games (2013) and the first girl to flip off a rail in competition. She was also currently ranked 2nd overall in the world, 5th for slopestyle and 10th for halfpipe at the time of her crash. But far beyond that, Jamie is the type of person everyone likes. She is little, bubbly and blond, and quite possibly the happiest, most positive person anyone will ever meet. April 11, 2015, Jamie crashed trying to become the first female to compete an off axis double flip in World Tour Finals WSI in Whistler, Canada. Jamie whiplashed her head onto the snow, her brain started bleeding in 8 spots and she hurt her right brain stem paralyzing her right side. Jamie slipped into a coma from a traumatic brain injury. For most people, this is truly devastating. But not for Jamie, beyond the miracle work she received from her medical staff Jamie kept her true personality through the whole experience, smiling and laughing. Jamie has exceeded everyone's expectations on her recovery. She has made a full recovery and returned to skiing the mountains. Although Jamie will not compete again at the level she did once Jamie has become a full time student at a private university getting all A grades. Jamie also has become a motivational speaker with her totally unique, one of a kind, inspiring story.*
