Academic Chronic Pain Anesthesiologist, Queen's University, Kingston, ON

The Department of Anesthesiology & Perioperative Medicine of Queen's University is accepting applications for an academic clinical anesthesiologist with expertise in Chronic Pain. Candidates should possess a Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada fellowship or equivalent, with additional fellowship training in the management of

Chronic Pain. Candidates must also be eligible for licensure with College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. The position would consist of a mix of clinical anesthesiology and chronic pain treatment.

Preference will be given to applicants who exhibit strong potential for innovative and scholarly research. Protected time and appropriate resources are available to those who establish a significant research program. Applicants must demonstrate strong potential for outstanding teaching contributions as well as evidence of an ability to work in an interdisciplinary, collaborative environment. Referees who can attest to the applicant's expertise are required.

Queen's is strategically located between Montreal, Toronto, and Ottawa, in historic Kingston, Ontario, on the shores of Lake Ontario. It offers excellent lifestyle opportunities and a strong academic environment. Remuneration is competitive within a unique alternate funding plan. The work schedule is flexible, with a large pool of members sharing in the call schedule.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
